

DID YOU KNOW

An Post and Ireland's booksellers have joined forces to help independent sellers' anti-Covid-19 efforts and to help unite the country around books and reading. Understanding the challenges facing independent booksellers with bookshops closing just as the national lockdown started driving customer demand for reading material, An Post and Bookselling Ireland worked together on a solution. An Post is making a special posting rate of just €2.95 per package available to independent booksellers for posting book packages up to 10kg across Ireland. Bookshops can avail of the offer by simply entering ;a special promo code on An Post's online shop at anpost.com, or by using a special barcode at their local post office.
